- Any Covid 19 exposure or infection, report immediately to coach/ safety director
- If the child doesn't feel well and has any symptoms of COVID-19, have them stay home and possibly get a covid test if symptoms continue.
- If a player on the team tests positive, the team should not practice that week and those that were in direct contact should get tested.
- If anyone on the team is in contact with anyone that tests positive or if they test positive themselves, they need to quarantine for 14 days before returning.
- No sharing water, use sanitizer at breaks, wash hands





Player Protection

- Player registration forms MUST be kept on-hand with coaches and team parent for liability and emergencies (practices, games, events)
- Shin guards MUST be worn during practices and at games
- Adult supervision ratio is 1:8 and two adults present (1 same gender as players not including coaches)
- Adult chaperone walk to restroom with 2+ players; do not send player by him or herself
- Parents pick-up your player ON TIME; contact coach if running late

Team & Spectator Positioning

- •Teams will be placed on opposite sides of field, on the half of the field that the AR is not on.
- •Strongly recommended that team bench/technical and spectator areas are marked with/by painted areas.
- •The home team will be on the AR1 side of the field.
- •Parents and spectators will sit on the same side of field as their team, located on the other half of the field.
- See diagram for allowable areas for teams and spectators to be seated; minimum 10 feet back from the touchline
- Game transitions: next teams to play on that field should not enter technical areas until previous teams have left; same for parents and spectators

Playing Time Policy

- 3.0 Minimum Playing Time Requirements (Article 7.B.4)
- (a) It is the Region's policy that players in a Core/Recreational program shall play at least three quarters of every game, when possible, and no player shall play four quarters of any game before all other players have played three quarters. If it is necessary because of roster size that one or more players can only play half of a game, those players should not be limited to half a game again until all other players on the team have also been limited to half a game. Late arriving players shall be substituted as follows: (i) if a player arrives during the first quarter, then the player shall play a minimum of two (2) of the remaining three (3) quarters; if a player arrives during the second or third quarter, then the player shall play a minimum of one (1) of the remaining quarters. Mayor's Cup Tournament games are considered Core/Recreational program games and are subject to these minimum play requirements.
- (b) For competitive Area, Section and tournament games (e.g., Area Playoffs, All-Stars, and EXTRA) it is the policy of the Region to encourage each coach to (i) play each player at least three quarters of every game, whenever AYSO Standard Policies and Protocols AYSO Standard Regional Policies & Protocols Attachments 18 AYSO Standard Regional Policies & Protocols 04/2017 possible, and (ii) to allow different players to start the first quarter of each game. For competitive Area, Section and tournament teams, each player is strongly urged to attend every team practice and game. Any player who misses practices or games regularly may have his/her playing time limited to one-half (but not less than one-half) of a game. (Adopted 05/04/2016)





5 Goal Policy

- Tustin has a 5 goal differential policy for the Core Program
- Any coach whose team wins by a differential greater than 5 goals is subject to disciplinary action
- It is the responsibility of the coach to plan ahead to help avoid exceeding the 5 goal differential
- See DC for assistance
- The EXTRA program 5 goal differential has been eliminated. This
 change applies only to EXTRA. All Core 10U, 12U, 14U, 16U, and
 19U teams are still required to adhere to this policy





Sportsmanship & Respect

- Developing Youth = Teaching Sportsmanship & Respect
- Respect
 - Player Player
 - Player Coach
 - Coach Coach
 - Player Referee
 - Coach Referee
 - Spectators Coach/Player/Referee
- All matches should end with players thanking and clapping for the opposing and their own spectators





Game Plan for 5U-8U

- The lower division do not require line up cards, but you still need a plan!
- Coaches should have a list of players for each quarter printed out for each coach
 - Sometime teams may have max players on a roster
 - Assures that every player has a chance to play a minimum of 3 quarters of the game
 - Coach must keep track and rotate player each game so each player sits 1 quarter
- Set some loose designated positions to start to teach the idea of positioning.
 - 1-2 players staying back to defend the goal, other 2-3 play up or midfielder position.
- Let players try different positions to find their strengths
- Pump them up and keep them having fun.
- · Cheering other team on when they make a good play and score a goal.
- There should be smiles on all of the players faces!
- Don't talk about the score, you shouldn't be keeping score and keeping track of wins
 - Focus on player individual accomplishments
- Manage the score
 - It isn't easy to keep the good players from scoring goals as a coach, be creative.
 - Move good player to defense on and off so they don't keep scoring goals after a few
 - DC's have tips to help make it fun still.
- Mix up the player on each field, and do not make a "Good" team and "Weaker" team
 - It is good to have weaker players have a chance to learn from stronger players
 - Match up strong players on the same field in your coach pre-meeting.





Game Plan for 10U-19U

- Have you line up cards printed and ready for the game
- Coaches should have a list of players for each quarter printed out with subs and positions
 - Sometime teams may have max players on a roster
 - Assures that every player has a chance to play a minimum of 2 quarters of the game
 - o Coaches must keep track and rotate player each game so each player sits 1-2 quarters
- Goalies need to be rotated, 1 player can not play more than 2 quarter in a game.
- Let players try different positions to find their strengths
- Pump them up and keep them having fun.
- 5 goal differential will be monitored, get creative and make the games fun for both teams.
- There should be smiles on all of the players faces!
- Manage the score
 - It isn't easy to keep the good players from scoring goals as a coach, be creative.
 - o Move good player to defense on and off so they don't keep scoring goals after a few
 - DC's have tips to help make it fun still.
- Focus on the development of the players and help them get to the next level.


- Pre-Printed Line Up Cards Are Required for All Competitive Matches

Steps to Print Line Up Card


Go to Team Central and click "Edit Roster".







Enter players jersey number in both the Details No text box and the Order text box.




Click "Update" when completed.








Click "Print Team Line Up"

Referees

- Referees give their time and make it possible for us to play games versus scrimmages
- Our referees are 100% volunteer
- The call of the referee is final and not open to debate
- It is the expectation of Tustin AYSO, that coaches will demonstrate respect for the referees and guide their players and sidelines to do the same
- Failure to respect the referee is a send off offense (including coaches, and parents). Anybody sent off will not be able to play or attend the next match.
- There is a ZERO TOLERANCE POLICY for YOUTH Referees.
- Players Play, Coaches Coach, Parents Cheer
- This is not the World Cup





Game Time

- Start your game AT THE SCHEDULED TIME!
- This means telling families to arrive early.
- End your game (especially 5U 8U) on time and EXIT THE FIELD!
 Post game activities should be conducted off field.
- Referees are expected to start game on time and make sure games conclude on time.
- Manage the clock during water breaks.
- First teams' inability to start on time impacts every other team during the day.





No Pets On Fields

- AYSO has a no dogs policy. You can find it posted all over
- TUSD has a no dogs policy. It is posted at the front of every school.
- We hold permits for City of Tustin Parks (Veterans & Tustin Sports Park)
 and therefore set the rules of field use during AYSO events. Our policy is
 no dogs.
- It is the responsibility of the Coach, Assistant and Team Parent to proactively communicate to all families that dogs are not permitted at AYSO events.
- If I see a dog on field at a practice or game I will ask its owner to remove it and tell them the coach should have notified team.



Field Set Up/Breakdown

- If your team(s) play the first game, your families are responsible for field set-up.
- If your team(s) play the last game, your families are responsible for breakdown.
- If the field lines need to be refreshed this is part of the setup.
- Arrive in the morning in time to setup the fields and warm your team up.
- Remind teams (via Team Parent) of the responsibilities.
- Please leave the fields in better shape than you found them (pick up trash even if it isn't "yours" and don't dump in the cans on fields)
- It is not the coach's job to set up. Coach & Team Parent should recruit other families to assist.





Uniforms

- Contact your Division Coordinator if you have any issues regarding uniforms
- Uniforms may not be modified with names and/or embellishments
- Record numbers for lineup cards
 - 10 U and above

- PDI = Player Development Initiative
- LOTG = Laws of the Game
